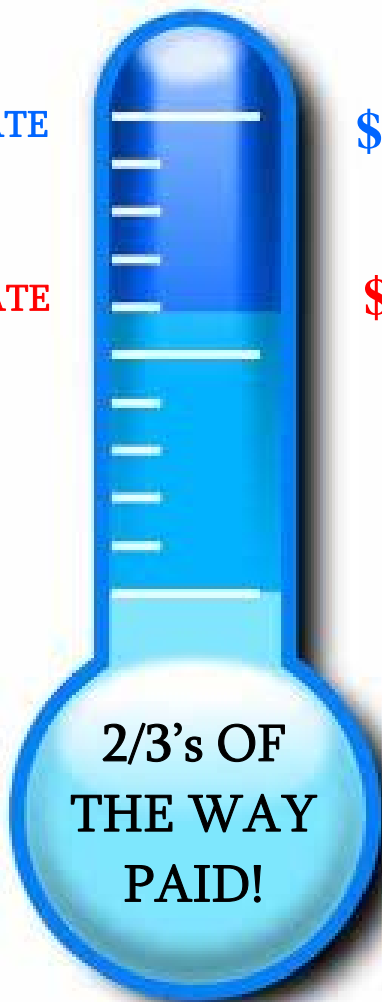

Sponsorship and Training in 2012

Training Update

It has recently come to our attention that sponsorship is not being given the priority that it should in all

programs. In simple terms all panel operators and broadcasters have an obligation and a responsibility to ensure **ALL** sponsorship logged is played in their respective program.

Remember, please do not play all the sponsorship items in one (1) break as this could place the 4EB broadcasting licence in jeopardy. ACMA regulations for community radio stations state no more than five (5) minutes of sponsorship in one clock hour. Be careful where you schedule your sponsorship items and spread them throughout your program. It might be a good idea to highlight special program items around the sponsorship, i.e. local news or community events. Please look at your program format or clock to see where sponsorship could be slotted into your program.

Also, all sponsorship in the Mairlist Sponsorship Folder is in **NUMBER ORDER** and not alphabetical so you can easily access the right one to play in your program. Check for the number first, then check the name and language to play.

Please advise the office before, during or after your program if there is a problem with sponsorship not available or not played for whatever reason.

Training in 2012 will be changing to accommodate more people interested in taking part in 4EB programs by offering the Broadcast Information Session on the first Tuesday Night of each month, starting February 2012. Panel Training will continue as a 7 week course on Saturday Mornings and Monday Nights.

H.E. Mr Abdul Malik Abdullah, High Commissioner for Pakistan will be making his official visit to Queensland in December.

When Marianne Prell got transferred in late 1980 to Brisbane from her firm in Sydney to open up a branch for them, little did she know then, that she would get involved with the then upcoming Ethnic Radio Station 4EB.

Searching for some contacts to socialise after work, a Swiss friend of hers suggested to contact the station, as there were some German people broadcasting there and they were looking for new active members. Within a few weeks, starting in November 1980, Marianne not only became a member, but also broadcast her own show. In those days you were shown the panel, given some records (33 & 45 speed) and expected to be able to produce the program. For Marianne it went smoothly and she threw herself enthusiastically into the jobs the group offered her. She became the ideal Volunteer; over the years taking the positions as Treasurer, Secretary, Publicity, Caterer including being an announcer. Marianne has held the position as the Vice-Convenor of the group for many years now.

Marianne never missed doing a program in those 30 years with the group, always attended all Radiothons, approaching sponsors, attending inside and outside functions, outside broadcastings, even baking at one stage over 60 ginger bread hearts with " I love 4EB" printed on, for 4EB's then 20th Birthday. Marianne also manufactured the curtains hanging in the conference room.

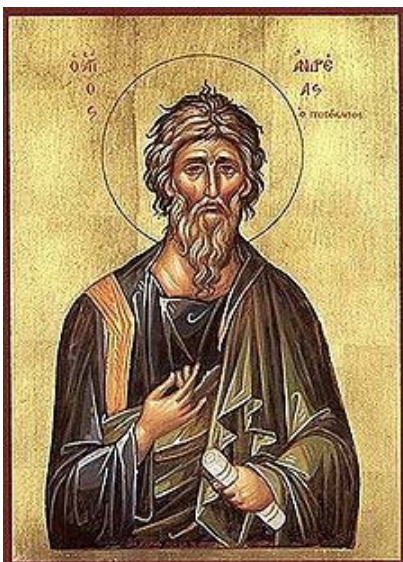
She did all this in her own quiet, but determined way, not for recognition, but for the love of volunteering for 4EB, and for her listeners to enjoy the music and news from their homeland.

Besides celebrating 30 years with 4EB-FM, it is also her Birthday this month~



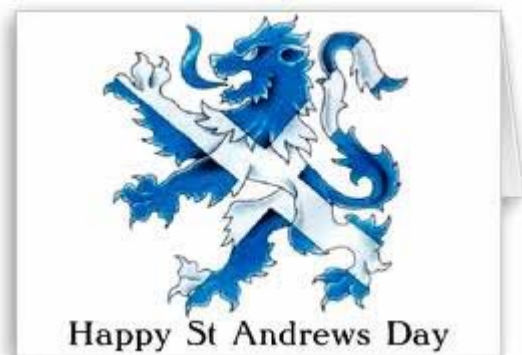
