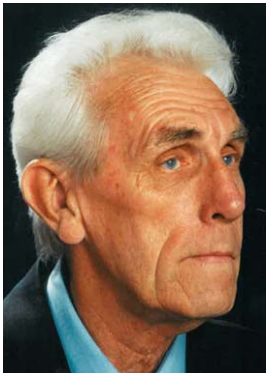
Welcome to our new Directors ~ Rudy van Wyk and Viet Tran.

Welcome to Rudy van Wyk and Viet Tran as new Board Members to 4EB



Rudy van Wyk
Committee Member,
Dutch Group

Rudy van Wyk arrived in Australia in 1954 and worked in Western Australia, News South Wales and Queensland as a licenced tradesman in steel. In Queensland, while employed by Evans Deakin and Pioneer Concrete, Rudy was sent to Gladstone, Mount Isa, Gove and Bougainville for various jobs and was in charge of another employee.

In 1970 Rudy purchased a Take Away Food Business called "Sinbad's Seafood" at Mount Gravatt which was built up successfully with Rudy taking over the cooking personally when it was necessary. With increased opening hours and staff "Sinbad's Seafood" was a popular place but was lost due to the 1974 Floods when insurance would not cover the damage, claiming it was "An Act of God", for which the insurance company was not responsible.

Rudy then went to Indonesia for 2 ½ years as General Foreman for a large American firm and then returned to Australia in 1978 and purchased a 511 acre property to start raising goats.

Rudy became involved with the Dutch Community and joined several organisations and became part of the committees of these organisations, including the 4EB Dutch Radio Group of which Rudy became a panel operator.

Rudy was elected as President of the Dutch Club (NAQ) for several years and was President of the Federation of Netherlands Organisations in Queensland for 10 years, until voluntarily winding up on its 25th Anniversary, as the aim for a Dutch Retirement Village had been reached at Birkdale. Rudy continued for another year as the Editor ~ writing, printing and posting the Bi-Monthly Magazine of the Federation until the 2011 floods put an end to that.

In 1994, Rudy was elected to the Board of Radio 4EB and appointed Publicity Officer. Rudy organised "Getting to Know You" on 21 May, 1995, which became an Annual Event and was, after a grant from Brisbane City Council, taken over by 4EB to make it bigger.

With male members of other 4EB groups, Rudy formed the dancing group, "The Black Swans", better known as the "Ugly Ducklings" and will probably again stimulate groups to interact.

My story with 4EB.

Veit Tran joined 4EB in 1994 and became a broadcaster.

By 1998, Viet is paneling and broadcasting a Sunday night program for the Vietnamese group once every 3 weeks.

In 2000 Viet introduced a weekly bi-lingual program (English and Vietnamese) aimed at younger listeners. However Viet had to stop after a few months because of a family member's illness.

In 2005 Viet became the Vietnamese' group's Convenor and still is to this present day.

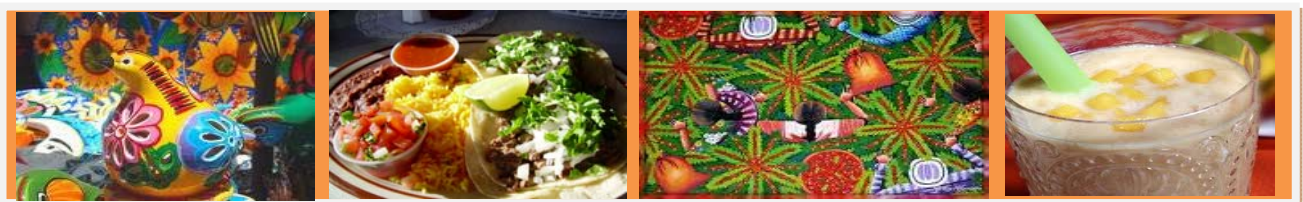

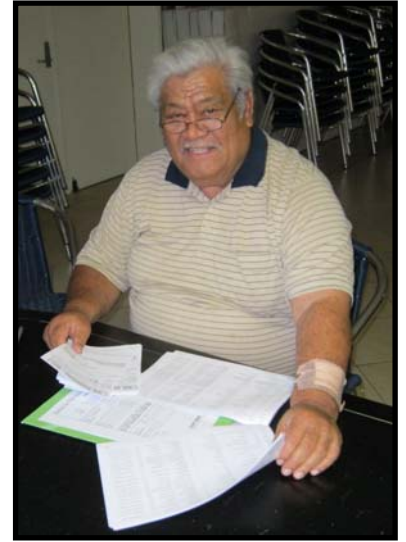

Mehregan Persian Festival and Radio 4EB's Outside Broadcast Van

The Persian Group of Radio 4EB joined the Iranian Community in celebrating "Mehregan" on 8th of October in Queen Street Mall.

"**Mehrgân** or **Jashn-e Mehregân** is a Zoroastrian and Persian (Iranian) festival celebrated since the pre-Islamic era to honor the Yazata of "Meh", which is responsible for friendship, affection and love. It is also widely referred to as **Persian Festival of Autumn.**" (Wikipedia).



The Persian Group took advantage of the celebration as it was one of the major community gatherings to promote Radio 4EB through handing out flyers, having the OB presence, and face-to-face chat with the crowd. It is worth mentioning that the group currently has around 18 active members, out of 60 financial members, contributing to its two weekly programs.





Following a recent incident which has since led to a little confusion regarding what is allowed and what is not allowed on air on Radio 4EB it is time to clarify a few points.

There is a fine line between what is advertising or sponsorship and what is a **FREE Community Announcement.**

A group community announcement is an announcement that is read on air by the broadcaster. It should only contain information regarding the event and it should be kept to 30 seconds in length. *(30 seconds is approximately 75 words in English.)*

A Community announcement should be for a free event. E.g. Church fete or similar meeting event. If there is any cost involved or entry (donations are not going towards a charity) it will be determined as sponsorship under the ACMA guidelines. All references to paid entry functions, travel specials, dance nights etc are regarded as sponsorships and these need to go through the office to be logged as per normal arrangements.

Remember, under the Sponsorship guidelines from ACMA only Five (5) minutes are allowed per clock hour for community radio. If broadcasters mention a sponsor on air then this is regarded as sponsorship and we need to be very careful. However, you are able to talk to a sponsor on-air but you need to be mindful of the content and also in giving listeners direct information on the sponsor's location, phone number and business information.

E.g. You are able to talk to a Real Estate Agent about the housing market as they are an expert in the field but you cannot mention where they work, business name, address or other contact details for that person.

Tokelau – First Program

A Tokeluan program was added to the schedule of languages this month with the first program going to air on Monday 10 October from 1.30pm – 2.15pm hosted by Sieni.



After attending the training sessions each week and successfully obtaining a panel licence recently, Sieni was ready to do her first program.

The Tokelaun community group officially launched their new radio program on Saturday 8 October in Logan City.

Tokelau is a Polynesian word meaning "North Wind" and is located midway between New Zealand and Hawaii or around 500 km north of Samoa and is a territory of New Zealand in the South Pacific Ocean that consists of three tropical coral atolls.

Tokelau History says the three atolls, Atafu- the largest, Nukunonu and Fakaofu have a combined land area of only 10.8km² and have been populated for over 1000 years with traditional tales linking the Polynesian settlement with Samoa and the Cook Islands.

- Lilac for the Sugar Cane Flower.
- Crimson for the Floral Emblem of Queensland, the Cooktown Orchid.
